NOTABLE ORIGINAL FEATURES:

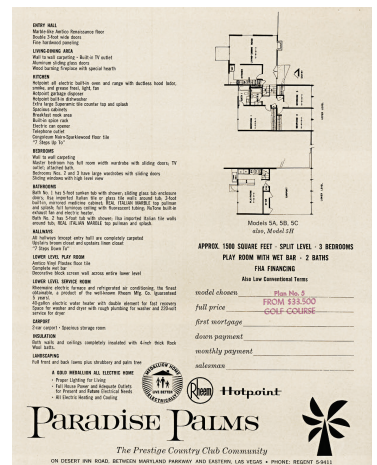
- Clerestory windows
- Kitchen cabinets (since painted and updated with new glass panel fronts)
- Bathroom vanities with sinks in two upper level bathrooms
- Sunken bathtub in upper master bedroom
- Phone nook at the top of the stairs
- Pool (diving board removed, accent tiles updated)

ADDITIONS:

- Main level extended circa 1980s, adding what is now the living room space
- Lower level carport enclosed circa 1980s converting the space into large bedroom & bath

RECENT UPDATES COMPLETED SINCE ACQUIRING THE HOME IN 2011:

- Front yard updated to a desert-friendly landscape
- House painted to warm gray tones with new front doors in orange
- Hot tub and surrounding tile installed in back yard
- New carpet throughout
- New light fixtures throughout
- New tile surround and glass enclosures for both upstairs bathrooms
- New floor tile and feature wall in lower level rec room
- New tile and fixtures in lower level bathroom
